


ATIU CREEK RECREATION CARE CODE



- There are tracks specifically designed just for walkers, mountain bikers and horse riders. Please keep to your designated tracks. Where tracks are shared follow the 'shared use code', marked using this symbol.
- There are a number of road crossings in the park. Always give way to traffic, and approach these crossings with care. Do not ride along the roads.
- Mountain biking and horse riding shall be conducted at a safe pace, galloping and racing is not permitted.
- All riders must wear helmets and any suitable protective clothing.
- Mountain biking and horse riding have their unique dangers, proceed at your own risk and ability.
- Never light fires.
- Remove rubbish and do not ride or walk through wetlands and streams.
- Remove horse manure off tracks and from stalls and use the compost bin provided.
- Don't skid, cut corners or make new lines.
- Clean your bike to prevent spreading weeds.
- Leave gates as you find them.
- Be prepared – take food, water, tools, First Aid and warm clothes.
- Avoid riding in the mud and rain.

Note: Tracks may be diverted or closed from time to time for maintenance, stock, or safety reasons.



Horse riding at Atiu Creek

Atiu Creek is a recreation park, planned and developed with outdoor activities, exercise and fun in mind.

- Walking, horse riding and mountain biking tracks have been created throughout the varied landscape on the park, in areas of exotic forest and native bush, up and down steep hills and through pasture.
- Following the track markers through the area shown will provide a good ride.
- Some are shared with walkers and mountain bikers , so respect others, and
- proceed at your own risk and ability.
- There are also many important cultural and heritage sites on this park, so please keep to the formed tracks.
- Enjoy your time out on the park, take care and visit again in the future.

- All riders must register for an Auckland Council Regional Parks Network Riding Pass and all pass conditions apply to Atiu Creek Regional Park.
- This is a free pass and allows council to communicate with riders about riding opportunities on regional parks.

Atiu Creek Specific rules:

- The horse parking area is located off of Run Road, approximately 15km past the main park entrance. The gate has a combination lock and the code for which is given to riders with a network horse riding pass
- A key is required to access the internal farm gates at Atiu Creek. The key costs \$10.
- There are a number of tracks where horses are not permitted – Clearfell Track, Ti Tree Point Trail and Kauri Point Track.
- Do not ride through areas that are currently being re-vegetated.

Overnight horse stays

- An 8 square km horse holding paddock next to the campground allows riders horses to stay while they camp. Limits and Conditions apply.

Please note that horses are not allowed into the campground. There is a water trough located in the holding paddock but you may need to provide supplementary horse feed during dry periods.

- At Atiu Cottage, A horse holding pen allows horses to stay while riders are booked into the cottage. Limits and conditions apply.

Horses are not allowed on any of the bach grounds.

It is the riders' responsibility to organise temporary fencing, tethering etc. for their horse in the holding pen.

A water trough is located in the pen but please note that you will need to provide feed for your horse.
